The March Coffee Morning continued to be popular and raised £259.


The Whist Drive raised f.58 this month.

HEDGEHOG NEWS

As we welcome spring in Burton Fleming, the hedgehogs will be coming out of hibernation looking for mates and food supplies.

If you are able to, keep your hedgehog food stations, in and around the village, running with plenty of water and food to ensure our hedgehogs have plenty to eat and drink, it would be very much appreciated.



ADVICE ON WHAT TO DO FOR A HEDGEHOG FRIENDLY VILLAGE

As well as providing access to roam, here are some other things to do to help hedgehogs;

- * Before using a strimmer, make sure the area to cut is clear
- * For a couple of days after applying wood preservative at ground level, protect your work from hedgehogs who like to lick it! It makes them very poorly.
- * Stop or reduce the amount of pesticides and poisons used.
- * Move piles of rubbish to a new site before burning them.
- * Ensure netting is kept at a safe height.
- * Check compost heaps before digging a fork in.
- * Cover drains and deep holes.
- * Ensure there is an easy route out of ponds and pools.
- * A hedgehog lying in the sun wobbling as it walks or with flies around it needs help. Use a gardening glove to collect it up, bring it indoors in a box and cover with an old fleece. Call Ali 0773 405 3699 or Jo 0771 755 2624
