


Burton Fleming History Group was transported back millions of years in Richard Mayerscough presented The Great Wold's Valley. Richard began by dedicating the talk to Rev. Edward Maule Cole (1883 - 1911) who wrote papers about the geology of the Wolds and Yorkshire.

Richard stated that the Valley and the Gypsey Race were a pivotal feature of the ancient Wolds landscape and then continued to describe the landscape of sixty and thirty million years ago. He spoke of the ancient River Nidd which flowed through the Wolds to the sea before land movement diverted it away from this area. Maps of this ancient landscape also highlighted the "shatter belt" and the Hunmanby Fault, both critical to the Wolds story.

We were shown pictures of some of the fault zones that can be found on the cliffs at Flamborough and it was explained that where there is a shatter belt there is very hard chalk and that is the reason why Flamborough Head has not eroded away like the rest of the chalk coastline.

During the last Ice Age the Wolds were not covered by ice but would have been a very dry and frozen tundra landscape. The sea,

however, was frozen and as the ice expanded it pushed up along the valley to Rudston but as the ice melted and retreated water poured down the valleys and with no escape formed Lake Rudston. This later became lake and marshland where people lived and settled. Nowadays many Mesolithic sites can be found along the line of Lake Rudston.



Richard also covered part of the structure and design of Burton Fleming Church which is built of cobbles which probably came from the Bartindale spillway and finished by displaying some of the many finds from his field walking sorties in this area. This talk was presented

to a full house, many of whom will, by now, be budding geologists.

We do not have a talk in December but to maintain a social side to the History Group our Christmas dinner is arranged for Friday 2nd December in the Burton Arms.




Neighbourhood Networks (formerly Neighbourhood Watch Groups)

Improving Urgent Care services - Public Consultation

NHS East Riding of Yorkshire Clinical Commissioning Group has launched a 12-week formal public consultation on proposed changes to our Urgent Care services. The consultation started on **25 October and will finish on 17 January 2017**. People can get involved by completing the online survey or attending one of the public drop-in events.

Under the proposals, two or three Urgent Care Centres (UCC) would replace the six Minor Injury Units currently operating across East Riding of Yorkshire. These UCCs would be open 16 hours a day, 365 days a year and provide consistent services across all the centres. **Find out more at www.eastridingofyorkshireccg.nhs.uk/urgentcare**
